Knowledge Centre

Even though we have a state-of-the-art Central Library, the students are not permitted to take their own books inside the library for reading. The Principal had requested us many times to help in constructing a building adjacent to the library for the students for open reading. Fortunately, one of our eminent alumni, Dr. MP Ravindra Nath came forward and promised to bear the full cost of constructing the three storeyed Knowledge Centre which has an area of 3000 sq. ft. The total estimate for the building including the required furniture was INR 80 lakhs. We are extremely grateful to Dr. Ravindra Nathan for his magnanimous contribution, with which we could complete the building within a year. We are sure it is because of his great love and dedication towards our alma mater that he has made this contribution.

The ground floor of the building is fully open to the students from 9 am to 8 pm so that they can read their own books and notes inside this air-conditioned hall. A part of the hall is utilised for the medical literary book library. The first floor is made into a mini conference hall which is utilised every day by various departments for academic programs. The second floor is utilised for conducting cultural programs.



Financial support to Under Graduates

Since 2006, we provide scholarships of Rs 10,000/- each to 45 undergraduate students. The recipient candidates are selected by a team of professors after checking their merit as well as financial background. We are extremely happy to point out that the major donor for this program is Dr. Krishna R Prasad (1974 MBBS batch), who is now settled in Milwaukee, USA. He has been donating USD 5000 every year for this noble venture. It should be noted that a good number of students of Trivandrum Medical College are coming from very poor families requiring financial support from its alumni.
